
Future Fossil Art Pack 1



Activity 3

Make a square for The Great Big Picnic Blanket (Part 1)

Working with artist Mary Hearne, we are creating a giant picnic blanket which everyone in the community can contribute to. The blanket will be made of recycled clothes or materials you find in your house and will be inspired by Future Fossil's themes.

When we can meet we will join all the squares together and have a picnic as part of The Opening Ceremony for Future Fossil.

Equipment: Scrap fabric e.g. tote bags, old clothing, tea towels cut into 22cm x 22cm squares. Felt tip pens, a selection of leaves from the garden or park. Paints (green, brown, yellow, blue & white), paint brush or needle & thread or sewing machine.

Activity 5



Grow a seed in an unusual place

Future Fossil will be seeded with plants to encourage habitats for wildlife. Seeds can grow in gaps in walls and pavements. See if you can find a place like this outside to grow a seed. Make sure you water it a little to get it started.

You can record your project by making a sketch or taking a daily photo.

Equipment: Camera or sketchbook. Seeds and soil.

Make an origami house


Make an origami house using recycled paper. What will your house be made of?
